This lesson will go with me wherever I may be sent in life. I hope that someday I, too, will be able to maintain such an example as to help others discover the true meaning of life.

May you always meet with good fortune, sir, and may you continue leading others as you have led me ... You will always have my gratitude, my respect and admiration, and my sincere friendship.

His methods worked: Wilkinson's teams won twelve straight conference titles, three national championships, and his record of 47 consecutive victories will never be broken. His obituary in the Des Moines Register was headlined "Longtime Coach Dies at 77: Sooner Legend Wilkinson Remembered as Class Act."
