Dear Mrs. Tuckerman:

I am sorry it will be impossible for me to go to Amherst before I leave for the south on the 29th of this month, as I would like to look over your property. I have had some correspondence with President Pease about it, and I understand you are anxious for a quick decision.

From the figures that I have received from President Pease, I understand the assessed value of the property for 1929 was \$13,300., including the garage, which you propose to take off the property. Therefore, I should think that \$16,000. would be a fair valuation of the property, and as Chairman of the Building Committee, I am willing to make this offer to you.

Will you be good enough to let me know your decision before I leave for the south?
