




New publication from the Clotfelter lab

Samantha Rothberg '21 and Professor Clotfelter recently published a

<u>paper</u> in *Animal Behaviour*, based on work conducted for Rothberg's senior thesis. They used social network analysis to identify winter flocks of black-capped chickadees in the Wildlife Sanctuary. Contrary to predictions based on energetics, birds formed more and stronger associations on warmer days, a finding that has implications for understanding social evolution in the face of climate change.




Senior Comprehensive Exams
