

TRACKING PROGRESS TOWARD THE FRENCH MAJOR | WORKSHEET

Instructions.

Use this worksheet to help you track your progress through the French Major. Complete the worksheet with all the courses that you have taken in the Amherst College French Department and, if applicable, with classes taken outside of the department. These may include:

- a) courses taken during study away;
- b) French or “related” courses taken at your previous institution (transfer students);
- c) French or “related” courses taken at another 5-College institution;
- d) “related” courses take in another departments at Amherst College.

Please review the “Major Requirements” page and the checklist on the French Department’s website for additional details. The table below summarizes which courses do and do not count toward the requirements.

For the major’s “**pre-1800 requirement**,” that is, the two courses exploring French and Francophone literatures, histories, and/or cultures before the nineteenth century:

- courses taken in the Amherst College French Department in the 310, 320, and 330 range (in English* or in French) will count toward the requirement.
- courses taken during study away may also count toward this requirement with the approval of the advisor. At least half of the course content must focus on periods before the nineteenth century (Middle Ages to 1800).
