Kanji Practice and Quiz Schedule <as of January 17, 2011>

The schedule below is to learn 60 new kanji, which is a minimal requirement for all of you. There will be two quizzes for each unit. The first quiz focuses on writing only new kanji at a word level. In the second quiz, you are required to write kanji for words in sentences, where old kanji may be included. The second quiz also includes Katakana reading and writing. (See below for Katakana writing.)

If you wish to move faster than the schedule and learn more kanji this semester, you can do so by submitting WPB and taking a quiz earlier. You can move faster at your own pace, but you are not allowed to fall behind the schedule. You need to schedule a quiz with the instructor ahead of time.
