p. 42 1-2 πλέα γὰρ φαίνεται τὰ τείχη. = τὰ γὰρ τείχη φαίνεται πλέα.

Why the singular verb with a plural subject?

What would φαίνεται γὰρ τὰ πλέα τείχη. mean?

I. 29 Περικλέα αἴτιον νομίζω. Indirect statement.

Direct statement: αἴτιος ὁ Περικλῆς. = ὁ Περικλῆς ἐστιν αἴτιος. ≈ ὁ Περικλῆς φαίνεται μοι αἴτιος. The link verb (or verb of being) links nominative (subject) to nominative (predicate noun or adjective). Link verbs = εἰμί, γίγνομαι, φαίνομαι.

What happens to case in the construction “I believe [say, claim, hear, etc.] x to be y”?

“Do you believe me to be him?”

A parallel construction: κακοδαίμονας νομίζω τοὺς γεωργούς.

>translation: vocabulary provided, unless the word has shown up since in "Vocabulary to be Learnt." You are responsible for recognizing participles formed from verbs that you know. The active participles are declined like ὥν, οὖσα, ὄν (#87, p. 77); the middle is -μενος, -μένη, -μενον.
