

**Oral Test #1**

**Date:** Tuesday, March 1st, 2011

**Time:** 6~7 minutes per person at your practice session time.  
(Some of you are assigned to another section for the test. Check the schedule online.)

**Format:** Individual presentation

**Focus:** Stage 1-5 and 1-6

**Tasks:** **(1) Introducing your place** (5 minutes maximum)

Showing maps, pictures, photos, and/or drawings (any kind of visual materials) to your audience, you will talk in detail about a place where you live, either your hometown, home country, or your room in the dormitory or at home.

In your speech, you should at least include;

- (a) where it is located
- (b) what exists there
- (c) description about certain things (store/building/furniture, etc)
- (d) likes and dislikes
- (e) changes of situation, function, and/or state
- (f) dates (with year/month/date), durational time, and age
- (g) information about person(s) you live with (roommate, family members, etc)

No text reference will be allowed at the presentation.

**(2) Answering questions from the audience** (2 minutes maximum)

Ask a few questions to each presenter, at least 4 or 5 questions in total.

- Preparation:**
- (1) Write a first draft, as a part of homework assignment #3. It should include the information (a), (b), (c), (d) specified above.
  - (2) Write a second draft, including the information (e), (f), (g) above. Be sure to edit your writing so that it flows smoothly. Corrections on your first draft should be made and reflected in your second draft. Submit your second draft on Tuesday, 2/22 when you turn in your HW#3 corrections.  
*(Your final draft, either 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> one, should be 600-800 letters in length.)*
  - (3) If required, write another draft (or make corrections) and submit it when you turn in your second corrections for HW#3 on Thursday 2/24.
  - (4) Prepare visual materials.
  - (5) Practice making a speech, so that you can speak smoothly without referring to your draft.

**Evaluation:** Content, fluency and pronunciation, accuracy, complexity, listening comprehension.
