2. You may ask me once in Japanese to repeat the question I asked, but not more than once.
3. You may confirm the meaning of my question in Japanese once.
4. If you still do not know my question, please tell me so in Japanese. I will move on to the next question.
5. After five seconds of silence (including non-Japanese interjections), I will move onto the next question.
