Course Description

This course is designed for students who have completed first year Chinese classes. The emphasis will be on the basic grammatical structures. The course reinforces the four skills (listening, speaking, reading and writing) through vigorous drills and practices.

Course Objectives

Upon successful completion of this course, students are expected to be able to:

- have a good command of the basic grammar, sentence patterns
- get the gist of simple Chinese texts, such as newspaper headlines
- sustain conversation in coherent paragraphs
- comprehend and write short essays on daily matters

Wednesday and Friday are drill sessions for sentence pattern, vocabulary exercises and supplementary readings. A review quiz will be given at the completion of each lesson on Monday. Homework is due on Friday.
