We are writing to let you know that Amherst College will be complying with a request from the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) to provide them with your contact information (name, current mailing and email addresses). The NCAA is requesting this contact information for all current and former student-athletes at member institutions in order to provide details about a proposed [class action settlement](#) that may entitle you to medical monitoring for concussion injuries.


While the College does not normally provide current student or alumni contact information without permission, we have been advised that non-compliance with this request would result in the issuance of a subpoena for your contact information.

In late July, the NCAA agreed to provide \$70 million for concussion diagnosis and testing of current and former NCAA student-athletes as part of a proposed agreement to settle claims arising out of several consolidated concussion-related class action lawsuits. Under the proposed settlement, all current and former NCAA student-athletes in all sports and divisions who competed at an NCAA member school may qualify for physical examination, neurological measurements, and neurocognitive assessments. The NCAA has established [a concussion settlement information website](#) that provides additional information regarding the case and the services that may be available to you in the future.
