AMHERST ATHLETICS

Amherst College has the oldest athletics program in the nation, dating back to a compulsory physical fitness regimen that was put in place for all students in 1860. Today, over a third of the student body participates in varsity sports and eighty percent are involved in intramural and club sports teams.

With 27 intercollegiate athletic teams, Amherst College student-athletes have successfully blended academics and athletics for decades. In addition to capturing 13 NCAA Division III team championships — including 10 in the past 10 years — and 78 NCAA individual titles, Amherst student-athletes have also excelled in the classroom — earning 35 prestigious CoSIDA Academic All-America selections, including 21 selections since 2008.

BRINGING THE PRESSURE

When the pressure is on, Andrew Yamin brings the pressure.

The senior defensive standout has made a habit of getting behind the line of scrimmage and wreaking havoc on opposing quarterbacks. Over the last three years, he has racked up 27.5 sacks and fifty-five tackles for a loss, establishing himself as the top rusher in the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC).

A team captain this year, Yamin in 2017 was named NESCAC Defensive Player of the Year and D3Football All-East Region. He was also selected by the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston as the Joseph P. Zbilski Award winner, given to the top defensive player in DII/DIII of New England.

His path to Amherst will always be tied to The Biggest Little Game in America.

Like many Amherst students, Yamin's college search and recruiting process centered around finding a good fit academically.

"I wanted to use athletics to get into the best academic school possible," said Yamin. "Amherst had a great reputation as one of the most elite schools in the country."



Yamin visited several NESCAC schools, including Tufts, where he enjoyed the larger size campus and the proximity to Boston, and Trinity, where his uncle still ranks among the all-time tackle leaders.

It was the overnight visit at Amherst, however, that made his decision easy. Yamin came for the 2014 Williams game, played for the first time in primetime under the lights. The 17-9 Amherst victory capped off a perfect 8-0 season and an outright NESCAC championship.

Even on a hectic and celebratory night, Yamin found the players and coaches welcoming and was able to realize that he would fit in with this group of men.

A running back who played some linebacker in high school and then a special teams player during his first year at Amherst, Yamin did not focus on pass rush until just a few years ago.

Like most players in their first year, Yamin served in a role player capacity. He was pretty active on special teams, so he knew there was a place to contribute, and he had the competitive mentality to compete on the scout team the same way he would on Saturdays.

"I've always been a very physical football player," said Yamin. "I used it as a form of competition and a way to be aggressive. I really try to dominate everyone that lines up across from me."

As he grew into a full-time defensive starter, he was asked to take over the unique position of Buck, a hybrid of linebacker and defensive end that is utilized by only a few programs in the country, following in the footsteps of former defensive stars



Jack Drew '16 and Chris Tamasi '15. Yamin credits the Amherst coaching staff for helping him work on his technique and teaching him that to accomplish goals defensively, he needed to outwork everyone around him in the NESCAC.

"There's a lot of pressure taking over a leadership role and a captaincy role - there's pressure to push guys around you to be better," said Yamin. "We had high expectations, but I like the way we dealt with it because it wasn't something we shied away from. We embraced it."

"I can't say enough about the senior class. I knew we had a lot of talent, and to be able to do the things we are doing is awesome. There are great leaders in this class, and I love this team. It's a special team this year."

As he prepares to face Williams with that class for the final time, Yamin stopped to reflect on the rivalry and what it is like to take the field against his archrival.

"As you grow into an upperclassmen and a leader, you learn more and more about tradition of Amherst and Williams and what the rivalry means to the program and the alumni. Especially as a junior or senior it's really special to take the field on a day like that."

Coach E.J. Mills is adamant about the importance of the Williams game, calling it the most important day of the year, whether the team is 7-0 or 0-7 heading into the game.

"It really is the most important thing you do throughout your time at Amherst," said Yamin. "It's unbelievable the amount of tradition and it's hard to comprehend how important that rivalry is to a lot of people. I think anyone on the other side would say the same thing."

HEAD COACH E.J. MILLS

A four-time NESCAC Coach of the Year, E.J. Mills has led Amherst to a 62-11 record and four undefeated seasons since 2009, and has solidified himself as one of the top coaches and defensive minds in the country.

Entering his 26th overall season on the Amherst sidelines, and his 22nd as head coach, Mills has been a part of 148 of the program's 645 total victories since 1877. Arriving in the Pioneer Valley in the fall of 1993 and serving as a defensive coordinator through the 1996 season, Mills helped the team improve its record in each of his four years as an assistant alongside former Yale head coach Jack Siedlecki. When Siedlecki made his move to lead the Bulldogs, Mills was named the interim head coach for the 1997 season, and has been at the helm ever since.

Amherst saw immediate success with Mills at the reigns, posting 7-1 ledgers three times during Mill's first 12 seasons before ultimately capturing the program's first perfect 8-0 record since 1984 in 2009. An historic season on several fronts, Amherst won their first-ever outright NESCAC title, claimed the Little III crown for the first time since 2004 and won at archrival Williams College's Weston Field for the first time since 1985 en route to Mills garnering AFCA Division III Region 1 Coach of the Year and NESCAC Coach of the Year honors.

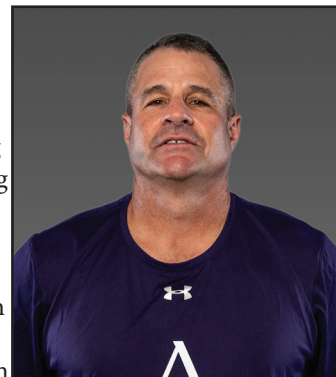
Since then, the Mammoths have gone undefeated three times (2011, 2014 and 2015), and have captured four more NESCAC titles to increase the program total to six. In 2011, Amherst led the league in scoring offense, turnover margin, and sacks en route to 13 All-Conference selections and another NESCAC Coach of the Year honor for Mills, while the 2014 squad boasted one of the top defenses in the country – leading Division III in scoring defense (8.9 ppg) and ranking 15th in total defense (273.1 ypg) – and racked up 11 All-NESCAC selections, including another league coach of the year honor for Mills, and the 2014 ECAC Team of Distinction Award.

Continuing their dominance into 2015, Amherst finished its campaign 8-0 for the second consecutive season to once again

claim the NESCAC title outright.

It was the first time the program finished without a loss in back-to-back seasons in its rich 138-year history. Concluding the year riding a program record 19-game winning streak, Amherst landed 15 all-conference selections – the most ever by the Mammoths – and the most since the 2011 season (13) in which it also finished a perfect 8-0. Mills was selected as the NESCAC Coach of the Year for the second time in as many years, and for the fourth time overall in his 20-year tenure at the helm of the Amherst football program.

Although Mills focuses on the development of his student-athletes more than he does statistics and records, the numbers cannot be overlooked. Under his tutelage as a defensive coordinator, the 1996 Mammoths led the nation in scoring defense, allowing a miniscule 8.4 points per game. In 2001, Amherst tied a 21-year old NCAA record by not allowing a single passing touchdown, and two years later, tied a conference record with four shutout victories. In 2009, Mills' squad led Division III in rushing defense (50.9 ypg) and finished third in scoring defense (10.4 ppg), and most recently in 2014, the Mammoths led the nation in scoring defense once again, surrendering just 8.9 points per game.

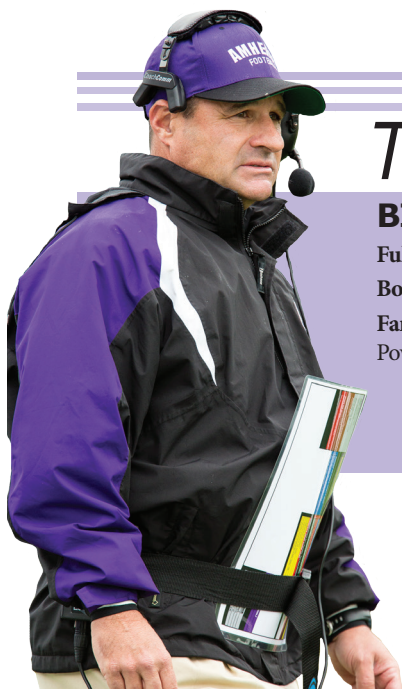

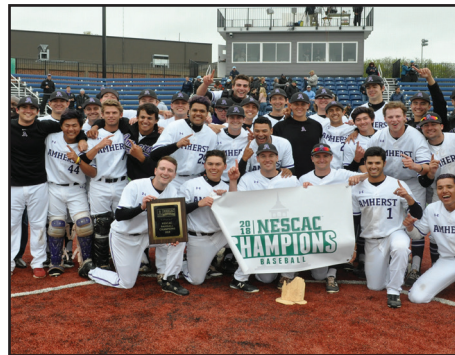

MATT BALLARD
15TH SEASON

OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR OFFENSIVE LINE

Establishing himself as one of the best offensive line coaches in Division III, Ballard was promoted to offensive coordinator in 2014 after 10 seasons with the program. During his tenure at Amherst, Ballard has notably helped guide O-Line groups that have led the nation in fewest sacks allowed (2008; 5), surrendered the fewest sacks in the NESCAC (2009-11) and paved the way for the top rushing attack in the conference (201.5 ypg) in 2015. A four-year letterwinner and 1990 graduate of the University of Albany, Ballard boasts a master's degree in education and spent five seasons as the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at WPI prior to his arrival at Amherst.



LUKE BUSSARD
14TH SEASON

DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR LINEBACKERS

Taking up the defensive coordinator position in 2009 Bussard made an immediate impact, helping Amherst rank first in Division III in rushing and third in scoring defense before spearheading a unit that surrendered just 12.6 points per game and led the NESCAC in sacks (28) during the Mammoths 8-0 season in 2011. Recording a second consecutive perfect season in 2015, Bussard guided Amherst's staunch defensive effort that ranked second in the nation in scoring defense (9.9 PPG) and ranked 25th in the country in total defense (293.6 ypg). Prior to Amherst, Bussard spent three seasons at Norwich University, guiding the team to a pair of ECAC bowl games and earning his MBA from the University in 2006. He and his wife, Natalie Blais, reside in nearby Sunderland with their two sons, Shane and Danny.



EDDY AUGUSTIN
11TH SEASON

SPECIAL TEAMS COORDINATOR DEFENSIVE LINE

Augustin has helped the Mammoths see continual success since joining the Amherst staff in 2008. In 2011 and 2013 Amherst led the league in sacks with 28 and 22, respectively, while in 2015, the D-line totaled 18 sacks to finish fourth in the NESCAC and the kicking game ranked first in the league in field goal percentage (90%) and second in field goals made (9). A native of Malvern, Pa., Augustin majored in psychology at Millersville University of Pennsylvania, before earning a master's degree in sports psychology from John F. Kennedy University in California. Augustin's coaching résumé also includes stints at Las Lomas High School in California, Norwich University, Mansfield University of Pennsylvania, Johns Hopkins University, and at his collegiate alma mater. He and his wife, Georgina, reside in the Pioneer Valley with their two daughters, Morgan and Avelynn.



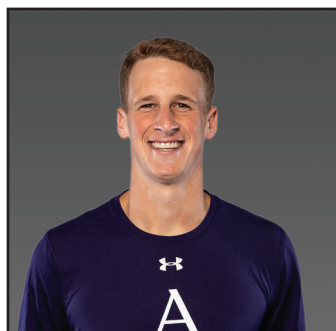
ASSISTANT COACHES

8TH SEASON

QUARTERBACKS, PASS GAME RECRUITING COORDINATOR

Joining the Amherst staff in 2011 after a four-year stint as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Georgetown University, Banks played an integral role in helping Amherst and the wide receiving corps average a league-high 27.6 PPG during the 2015 season. An English major and four-year letterwinner for the Hoyas, Banks recorded 84 tackles (61 solo), six interceptions and 13 pass deflections as a standout defensive back and boasts a master's degree in teaching and learning from Marymount University (2007).



MITCHELL THOMPSON
4TH SEASON

WIDE RECEIVERS

Thompson returns to Amherst for a third season after spending 2016 as a defensive backs coach and defensive coordinator at Oberlin College. During his previous stint with Amherst (2014, 2015), Thompson coached the Mammoth outside linebacker corps, including two All-NESCAC selections, in back-to-back undefeated seasons. A four-year letter-winner and two-time all-conference selection with the Generals, Thompson appeared in 41 games at defensive back for Washington and Lee before graduating in 2014 with a bachelor's degree in European History.



OWEN WATROUS
2ND SEASON

DEFENSIVE ASSISTANT

A 2016 graduate of Ithaca College with a degree in Business Management, Watrous enters his second season as a defensive assistant for the Mammoths following a one year stint at UMass-Amherst aiding the athletic administration staff. A four year member of the Bombers' offensive line, Watrous comes to the Pioneer Valley as a two-time Empire 8 conference champion and has appeared in two NCAA Championship tournaments.

RUNNING BACKS

A 2018 graduate of Division II member Notre Dame College (S. Euclid, Ohio), Grove was a three-year starter at quarterback and amassed career stats of 7,647 yards passing, 2,198 yards rushing, and 103 touchdowns. He was a 1st Team All-Mountain East Conference (MEC) member in 2016 and 2017 and led his teams to a 22-11 career record, while also serving as a team captain during his senior year. Grove was a two-year starter at Lakota West High School in Beckett Ridge, Ohio, and went 19-5 in his career, the winningest quarterback in school history.

THE SERIES

"The Biggest Little Game in America" will be played for 133rd time today, with Williams holding a 72-55-5 record since the first meeting in 1884. Amherst had won six straight meetings before the Ephs victory last year. That equalled the longest winning streak for Amherst in the series. Prior to that, Williams had won five of six meetings from 2005-2010. Amherst has not lost to Williams at home since the 2010 season.

LAST TIME OUT

AMHERST

With a chance to clinch the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC) football championship on the road at Trinity, Amherst College suffered a 27-16 setback to the Bantams at Jesse/Miller Field.

Senior Bo Berluti caught nine passes for 142 yards, but Trinity got 205 yards rushing from Max Chipouras, who scored twice on the ground as the Bantams (7-1) handed Amherst their first loss of the season (7-1).

Against an Amherst defense that was allowing just 53.7 rushing yards per game, Chipouras broke free on a third down for a 70-yard touchdown rush with 2:53 remaining to seal the win for the Bantams after Amherst had cut a seven-point deficit to four on a 33-yard field goal by Andrew Ferrero '19.

Ollie Eberth completed 17-35 passes for 217 yards and ran for 31 yards on 13 rushes. Jack Hickey '19 gained 54 yards on the ground and scored from three yards out with 5:38 left in the second quarter to give Amherst a 13-7 lead. A 41-yard pass that Berluti leapt over a defender to corral set up that Hickey score.

Trinity took a 20-13 lead and looked for more, but Avery Saffold '20 picked off a pass at the Amherst five-yard line to stop the Bantams late in the third quarter.

Andrew Sommer '19 led all players with nine tackles for Amherst, while Saffold had five tackles, the interception, two pass breakups and a blocked field goal.

WILLIAMS

Jackson Bischooping threw two beautiful touchdown passes to Frank Stola in the fourth quarter, but the Ephs' furious comeback fell just short as Williams (5-3) fell to Wesleyan (5-3), 21-14.

Down 21-0 in a game that seemed all but over, freshman quarterback Jackson Bischooping, filling in for the injured Bobby Maimaron, threw a fade to sophomore wide receiver Frank Stola in the back-left corner of the end zone to pull within 21-7 with just under four minutes to go.

After a perfect onside kick by sophomore kicker Min Kyu Park, Bischooping led the offense on another touchdown drive, this one lasting just four plays. On a similar play to the first touchdown, Stola made an even more impressive catch on a fade pass, barely staying inbounds but nonetheless putting Williams back into the game, now down only one score.

Park's second onside kick bounced around with a chance for both teams to recover, but was eventually recovered by Wesleyan. The Ephs forced a punt and had a chance to tie with 1:29 to go and one timeout, but the stout Wesleyan defense prevented Williams from picking up a first down, sacking Bischooping on 3rd down and forcing incomplete passes on 1st, 2nd and 4th. The Cardinals then knelt out the clock to preserve the win.

It was the sixth win in a row in the head-to-head series for Wesleyan, who had shut out the Ephs' offense for seven straight quarters before the fourth-quarter comeback.

LAST MEETING

Amherst was denied a NESCAC championship with a 31-24 loss in overtime at Williams on November 11, 2017

Three unanswered Mammoth touchdowns in the final 20 minutes of regulation were enough to push the archrivals into overtime for the first time since 2001, however Amherst was unable to counter an Bobby Maimaron 11 yard touchdown run in OT as Williams clinched a 31-24 victory.

The Ephs owned a 385-270 edge in total offense in the contest, while Amherst finished 4 for 17 on third down tries and registered a sack, two pass breakups and an interception.

Ollie Eberth led the Mammoths' rushing game, gaining 35 yards on 10 attempts, while Bo Berluti notched 37 yards on four receptions. John Callahan '19 registered a contest-high 14 tackles, including 12 solo, while Andrew Yamin '19 logged nine tackles and a sack. Avery Saffold '20 and Ballard chipped in seven tackles each.

Bobby Maimaron finished 23-for-41 through the air for 183 yards, and led the Ephs' rushing game with 133 yards and four touchdowns on 33 attempts, while Adam Regensburg led Williams' receivers with 78 yards on nine receptions. On defense, Luke Apuzzi led the Ephs with seven solo tackles and a pass breakup, while Amyhr Barber added six stops.

DARP ROCK



The James E. Ostendarp Bronze Plaque Memorial was revealed on Oct. 20, 2007, prior to Amherst's Homecoming game against Wesleyan University. Since then, the Mammoths have gathered at the "Darp Rock" on Fridays during the season, providing the captains a chance to address the team the night before each game.

Separate from his on-field successes as a coach, the Darp was crucial in the development of the academically minded student-athlete at Amherst. "The Darp stood for everything that we still preach to our players now," says E.J. Mills. "Amherst football has a great tradition of having the finest student-athletes in the country, and when you think about the overall program in this era, it is synonymous with one man: Jim Ostendarp."

"The Darp" led Amherst to a 168-91-5 record from 1959-91. He notably won 36 games and lost only four from 1961-65, with his 1964 and 1984 teams each finishing at a perfect 8-0. Engraved on his plaque—along with his picture and biographical information—is one of his most famous quotes:

"ANY DAY AMHERST PLAYS IS A SPECIAL DAY."

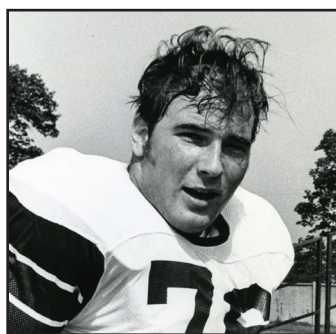

AMHERST AND THE NFL

Four Amherst College alumni began successful careers in the National Football League (NFL) in the 1970s, marking one of the most exciting times in the history of the school's athletic department. On Aug. 17, 2010, these four former Amherst players were profiled in Seth Schwartz's USA Today feature titled, "Tiny Amherst's four NFL alums enjoy off-field success." Here is a closer look at what those four players brought to the NFL.



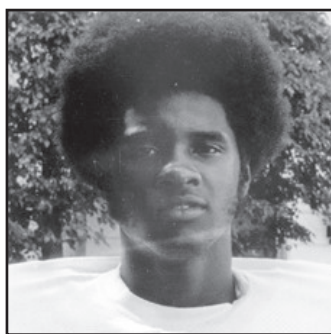
Doug Swift '70

Doug Swift '70 was a six-year starter (1970-75) at outside linebacker for the Miami Dolphins, who won the 1972 and 1973 Super Bowls. Swift played a vital role in helping the 1972 squad finish with an unblemished record of 17-0, intercepting three passes during the regular season, and another two in the opening round of the playoffs. His second INT of that game is known as one of the biggest plays in team history, as it came late in the fourth quarter and put a stop to a potentially game-winning drive. Swift played in 78 regular season games and 11 more in the postseason before retiring in 1976 to attend medical school.



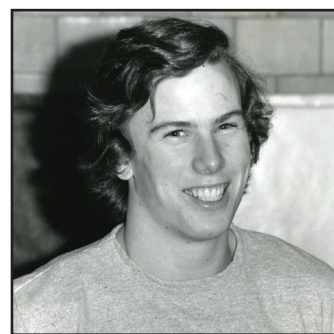
Jean Fugett '72

Jean Fugett '72 spent four years with the Dallas Cowboys (1972-75) and another four with the Washington Redskins (1976-79). Selected by the Cowboys as a tight end in the 13th Round of the 1972 NFL Draft, Fugett caught 156 passes for 2,270 yards and 28 touchdowns in 103 regular season games. Fugett recorded at least five touchdowns in each season from 1976-78, with his 631 receiving yards and five touchdowns in 1977 earning him a Pro Bowl selection. He also played in nine postseason games, helping the Cowboys advance to the 1975 Super Bowl. During a 24-21 win over the San Francisco 49ers in 1976, Fugett caught three touchdown passes from Joe Theismann.



Freddie Scott '74

Freddie Scott '74 was selected by the Baltimore Colts in the 7th Round of the 1974 NFL Draft and went on to enjoy a 10-year playing career as a wide receiver. In four seasons with the Colts (1974-77), and six with the Detroit Lions (1978-83), Scott caught 262 passes for 4,270 yards and 20 touchdowns in 132 regular season games, also playing in five postseason games. During a dominant 1981 campaign with the Lions, Scott racked up 1,022 receiving yards and caught five touchdowns, putting together three of his five career 100-yard receiving games. The owner of several Amherst records, Scott was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2001.



Sean Clancy '78

Sean Clancy '78 spent two years in the NFL as a linebacker for the Miami Dolphins (1978) and then St. Louis Cardinals (1979). Chosen by Miami in the 8th Round of the 1978 Draft, Clancy played in all 16 regular season games to help the Dolphins post an 11-5 record and advance to the postseason as the best team in the AFC East Division. Clancy played in 10 of the Cardinals' final 12 games the following year, but his third season in the league would be cut short after he broke his foot making a tackle during training camp. Also used on special teams, Clancy's career statistics are unknown because the NFL did not begin tracking tackles until 2001.



A Closer Look at Alex Bernstein '97

A native of Edina, Minn., **Bernstein** transferred to Amherst in 1994 and played three seasons on the defensive line for the Purple & White. As a senior, he was named a USA Division III Senior All-Star, NESCAC Defensive Player of the Year, All-ECAC First Team, New England Football Writers All-New England, Gridiron Club Division II/III Defensive Player of the Year, and AFCA Division III Coaches First Team All-American. Bernstein became only the fifth NFL player from Amherst when he signed with the Baltimore Ravens as an undrafted free agent following the 1997 NFL Draft. He changed positions from defensive tackle to offensive guard, and during his four-year professional career, was a reserve offensive lineman for the Ravens, New York Jets, Cleveland Browns, and Atlanta Falcons.
